*Silly Spanish boy, how old are you?*

### 5. Juan y Gilberto juntan geckos

*Juan & Gilberto and collecting geckos (!)*

### 6. El obispo vasco de Bailén busca el obispo vasco de Vitoria

*The Basque Bishop from Bailén is looking for the Basque Bishop from Vitoria*

### 7. El perro de Rosa y Roque no tiene rabo

*Rosa & Roque's dog has no tail ! 😊*

### 8. Poquito a poquito Paquito empaca poquitas copitas en pocos paquetes.

*Little by little Paquito packs a few cups in a few boxes*

### 9. En la población de Puebla, pueblo muy poblado, hay una plaza pública poblada de pueblerinos.

*In the village of Puebla, a very populated village, there is a public square full of villagers*
