Lord Peter Hennessy to deliver the third Annual Mullins Lecture.

Lord Hennessy of Nympsfield is a prominent English Historian and academic, specialising in the History of Government. He is a cross bench peer in the House of Lords and since 1992 has been the Attlee Professor of Contemporary British History at Queen Mary, University of London.

Following a grammar school education, Peter Hennessy studied at Cambridge and Harvard before moving into journalism, writing for a number of newspapers including *The Times* and *The Economist* as well as making many contributions of political and historical commentary on the BBC. He is the author of a significant number of books on the British Political System, and has most recently had a prominent role on BBC Radio 4 as well as during the Scottish Referendum Debate.

The title for Lord Hennessy's lecture will be 'Watching Prime Ministers'.
