The 1<sup>st</sup> XI meanwhile secured their 4<sup>th</sup> consecutive County Cup. ## <u>Cricket</u>

The Cricket season has probably been most affected by the rain this term, but the U15s made it through to the T20 County Final, after beating Dauntsey's in the semi and after one cancellation played Marlborough College. Despite acquitting themselves well, the boys were unable to bring the trophy home. A huge thank you to Mr Churchill who in Mr Gilmour's absence ran the team and took the fixture.

Unfortunately the Cathedral VI's tournament was cancelled due to bad weather this year and rather curtailed our cricketing involvement lower down, but with plenty of strong players throughout we hope to have another strong season with plenty of play (weather permitting) next year.

### <u>Tennis</u>

We were lucky to get all of our tennis played early in the term before the poor weather struck. Both the Y8 and Y10 teams won their Aegon Wiltshire Division and qualify for knock out rounds in the Autumn, defeating the likes of Warminster, Dauntsey's and Marlborough College along the way.

### **Athletics**

Arguably this term's greatest success in terms of performance has been in athletics with the Minor, Junior, Inter and Senior boys all winning Area Sports with a large contingent going on to represent Salisbury Schools at the County Finals. From these, 6 boys were selected for South West Champs with one making it through to National Finals.

The U15 and U13 teams both made it to the Regional Finals of the English Schools Athletics Cup, both finishing second and narrowly missing out on Nationals despite the U15 team reaching our highest ever points total. A scratch Y7 team also came second at the School Games, narrowly missing out on victory.

He would welcome any fresh faces looking to run cross country next term. Without his unwavering support we would quite often be stuck, not just during this term, but across all three.
