### **Breakfast Revision Sessions 2017**

We are planning to run breakfast revision sessions before the two English Literature exams (22<sup>nd</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup> May) and the two Language exams (6<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> June). These will run for an hour before each exam (7.45am – 8.45am) in the Drama Studio, and will be led by members of the English team. Please note that these are top-up sessions only: we expect pupils to have put in a lot of preparation and revision as part of their independent revision schedules before this point!

These resources will be constantly added to as we move through revision lessons towards the exams, so pupils are advised to check the following places regularly:
