## Deadline for Payment: Thursday 6 December 2018

The first PSHE talks will be taking place on Friday 7 December and we have arranged for Dr Aric Sigman, a highly qualified health education specialist, to return to school and deliver a series of Dependency talks to boys in Years 7, 9, 10 and 12.

Dr Sigman is a Fellow of the Royal Society of Biology, Associate Fellow of the British Psychological Society and a Chartered Scientist awarded by the Science Council. As a health education specialist he lectures at schools and has worked on teenage health education campaigns with the Department of Health and is the author of five books on PSHE-related topics. Dr Sigman has twice been invited to address the European Parliament Working Group on the Quality of Childhood in the EU in Brussels, once on reducing alcohol misuse among children and adolescents, and again on the impact of electronic media and screen dependency.

Each selected year group will spend a double period with Dr Sigman and talks will be tailored appropriately. Year 7 and Year 10 will attend a talk on 'Managing Screen Time and Screen Dependency', Year 9 will attend a talk on 'The Facts about Alcohol' and Year 12 will attend a talk on 'The Facts about Alcohol and Drugs'.

I do hope that you will see the benefit of supporting these valuable events which are a key part of your son's PSHE programme.
