**Dear Parents** 

I hope that your sons' Year 12 exams went well; results should be known by boys by half-term, and we will also formally report them to you after that.

After Half Term we have Activities week (3 - 7 June). This week is a mixture of compulsory sessions, talks and a fun trip to Thorpe Park (see previous letter – deadline for replies is 17 May). Boys are only expected to attend school if they have an activity. They should wear uniform (apart from when they go to Thorpe Park). The list of activities is overleaf. Boys should also use the week to get ready for their lessons in June and should complete all work set on Insight for their subjects.

Lessons start again on Monday 10 June: from that date onwards the Year 12 students will take on the responsibilities of Year 13 and so they will be registered by me in the Common Room. This means that all students should be in school by 8.40am every day (unless they have a lesson period 1 at SWGS). Boys should also make sure that they are in full school uniform every day. They need to be clean shaven and should not be wearing any jewellery: ear-rings and finger rings are both unacceptable; we would welcome your help in reinforcing the school rules! A new issue to flag up is parking for those boys who have passed their driving test in recent months; occasionally we do get complaints from our neighbours in streets near the school, so we do ask if they drive to school that they park considerately and not in the nearby estates or the park short-term carpark.

After Half Term Mrs Armstrong will be running a Careers and HE programme for the Year 12 students. This will take place during Enrichment on Tuesdays and during Sixth Form Assembly and will give the students advice on applying for university (including studying abroad), apprenticeships and jobs. In the meantime it would be a good idea for the boys to spend some time before Half Term and Activities week, in planning and booking Open Days. They will need to complete a form to request an absence from school (they have already been emailed this form). We would also like to remind you that the Oxbridge application tests and the BMAT Medicine test will be held this year in the autumn half-term, on Wednesday 30 October 2019. Most (but not all) students applying to Oxford or Cambridge have to sit an aptitude test (held at BWS) on this day, and most (but not all) Medicine and Veterinary applicants take the BMAT test at this point. We will ensure in the later summer term that all our aspiring Oxbridge and Med/Vet applicants are clear about which tests are needed for their courses, but for now please avoid booking a family holiday on 30 October if there is any possibility your son might be interested in those kind of applications.

Please note that Prize Giving takes place on Thursday 19 September at 3.30pm and all of the current Year 12 students are expected to attend. Parents are of course also very welcome.

If your son is absent from school we would be grateful if you would report it via Insight or the Absence phone line (01722 333851). Please contact us every day that your son is away.
